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It is with pride and fulfilment that we record the prestigious A+ Grade awarded to our Alagappa University by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council. The 3.64 CGPA given on the 4 point scale under the new grading system has placed the Alagappa University first among the four State Universities that obtained A+ Grade during the assessment period of July 2016 to April 2017. The glad tidings came a month after, when the University Community gratefully recollected and cherished the philanthropy of Vallal Dr. Alagappan in a function organised to celebrate 108th Birth Anniversary of the Founder. The encomiums showered on Alagappa University would have certainly gladdened the heart of the Founder who would be watching with pride and pleasure from the undiscovered country the heights of glory the University is reaching day by day.

As leaders, universities are expected to be aware of different societal needs and act pragmatically and consciously paving the way to others. Global warming and the resultant havoc associated with it is an issue deliberated throughout the world today. Increasing the green cover should be the first step towards mitigating the heat wave. Growing plants requires increasing the ground water table. The experts have reiterated the importance of judicious planning of discharge and recharge of water from all water bodies to come out of bone-dry conditions. The 108th Birth Anniversary of Vallal Dr. Alagappa Chettiar was celebrated on 6-4-2017 in an atmosphere of cheer and joy and in a manner that befits the occasion dedicating ourselves to the task he began and to the cause he cherished.

The grand function started with Vallal Alagappan Museum being declared open by no less a person than his one and only daughter Thirumathi Dr. Umayal Ramanathan, Life Member of the Syndicate of Alagappa University, in the presence of Thiru AL. Ramanathan, Thiru Vairavan Ramanathan and Thavathiru Kundrakudi Ponnambala Adigalar. Mr. K.R. He described the Founder's life as a saga of hard work and humanitarian activities and said that the institutions started by him have been a perennial source of benefit to the rural youth of Tamil Nadu. Thiru Soma Valliappan, Writer and H.R. ## EXIT MEETING OF NAAC PEER TEAM

A National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) Peer Team visited Alagappa University, Karaikudi, from April 10th to 12th, 2017.

An intensive scrutiny of the resources – teaching, research and extension – and progress achieved by Alagappa University during the last five years was made by the eight-member NAAC Peer Team, headed by Prof. Nageshwar Rao, Vice-Chancellor, Uttarakhand Open University, Haldwani. The other members of the team were: Dr. P.S.Grover, Guru Gobind Singh Indraprastha University, Prof. Dr. D.K.Maheshwari, Gurukul Kangri University, Prof. R.G. Sonkawade, Shivaji University, Dr. Dilip S. Patil, University of Mumbai, Prof. Sanjai Bhatt, University of Delhi, Prof. Asha Shukla, Barkatullah University and Dr.J.K.Tandon, University of Rajasthan.

The Exit Meeting of the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) Peer Team was held on 12-4-2017 at the Convocation Hall.

Prof. M. Selvam, Coordinator, Internal Quality Assurance Cell, while introducing the members of the Committee, which consisted of eminent Vice-Chancellors and distinguished academics, said that it was the 3rd cycle of NAAC accreditation visit.

Prof. S. Subbiah, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University, welcomed the members of the team and said all its suggestions would be earnestly taken into account; and he sincerely hoped that everyone in the University would strive for taking the University to greater heights by their dedicated work and team spirit.



Speaking on the occasion, Prof. Nageshwar Rao, Chairperson of the NAAC Peer Team, said that he was gratified to see the involvement and attachment of the staff of this great University to their work place

and he complimented the team spirit among the workforce in the institution. He added that “though the University is located in a rural and backward region, the entire machinery of the University is striving hard to take the University to lofty heights”. He stated that the University Grants Commission insists on the enhancement of quality of education in every respect by academic accomplishments and research attainments; and this has to be borne in mind by all academicians.

It may be recalled that the first NAAC Peer Committee visited to the University in May 2005 and awarded “A” grade after reviewing the progress of all the Faculties and the infrastructural facilities at the University. Again, in November 2011, the second NAAC Peer Team visited and re-accredited the University with “A” grade by giving 3.21 points.

## Alagappa University Accredited with A+ Grade by NAAC



Alagappa University, Karaikudi, has been awarded prestigious A+ Grade by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council (NAAC) in the third cycle of accreditation for a further period of seven years with effect from 2.5.2017. The result was declared at the 24th meeting of the Standing Committee of the NAAC held on 2.5.2017 and the official communication was received by the University from the NAAC office.

Of the 86 Universities and Deemed Universities assessed by the National Assessment and Accreditation Council after the introduction of New Grading System during the period from 1st July 2016 to April 2017, nine Universities obtained A+ grade. Among these nine Universities, four are State Universities and the other five are Deemed Universities. Alagappa University, Karaikudi, is the First State University in South India to obtain the first place with 3.64 Cumulative Grade Point Average (CGPA) on the four-point scale, among the four State Universities accredited with A+ grade in India. It is pertinent to note that Alagappa University is one of the youngest institutions to be awarded with A+ grade and to obtain the First Place in Tamilnadu.

The other three State Universities which obtained A+ grade include Savitribai Phule Pune University of Maharashtra, Utkal University of Odisha and University of Jammu of Jammu and Kashmir State, with CGPA of 3.60, 3.53 and 3.51 respectively.

While referring to overall strengths of Alagappa University, the NAAC Peer Team has pointed out five salient points, which include, (1) Sophisticated Science Laboratories (2) Experienced and Committed Faculty (3) Good Physical and IT Infrastructure (4) Eco-Friendly Environment and (5) Good Alumni Support.

Making a reference to excellent opportunities that the University provides to enhance its performance, the NAAC Peer Team reports that (1) Linkages with Local Industries (2) Augmented Placement Services and (3) Skill Training across several sectors would serve as versatile avenues.

The NAAC Peer Team assessed the performance of various departments, centres, common facilities and cells, etc. in respect of curricular aspects, teaching, learning and evaluation, research, consultancy and extension, infrastructure and learning resources, student support and progression, placement programmes, governance and leadership, innovative practices, etc.

Taking note of the consistently high NAAC grade, namely, 'A' achieved by Alagappa University in the 1st and 2nd accreditations done earlier in 2005 and 2011, the NAAC has intimated that validity period

of the present 3rd accreditation for the University would be 7 years, instead of usual 5 years.

The steady and uninterrupted performance enhancements decisively exhibited by the University in all dimensions -- (1) Curricular Aspects (2) Teaching-Learning and Evaluation (3) Research Consultancy and Extension (4) Infrastructure and Learning Resources (5) Student Support and Progression (6) Governance Leadership and Management and (7) Innovations and Best Practices - enabled the University to stand tall amongst its peers.

The NAAC Peer Team has highlighted and commended the superior merits of Alagappa University in detail in its accreditation and assessment report on the University.

28.3.2017 at Alagappa University Resource School for Differently Abled in the School Campus.

The history shows that students from the neighbouring countries came to the very ancient Nalanda University in India to learn the art of Yoga, Medicine, Mathematics, etc. Yoga, in-fact, has its origin in India but unfortunately people of India have neglected to enjoy the immense benefits of this great art. But, today there is a worldwide awakening about the benefits of this art of Yoga. Nalanda University was able to accommodate more than 10,000 students and 2,000 Faculties served in that University. This is an evidence for India's quality of higher education. In this aspect, the adapted yoga education for children with special needs is the first of its kind, and Alagappa University is going to offer the training programme.

In an Awareness Programme about the "Value of Yoga in Daily Life", organized jointly by the

Yoga Centre of Alagappa University, Karaikudi and Mahayogam Foundation, Kancheepuram on 1.5.2017 at Umayal Stadium of Alagappa University College of Physical Education, the physically challenged Kumaresan created a national record, indeed a sensational record, in the presence of the Coordinators Mr. Venkatesan and Mr. Ravichandran of CECRI, Karaikudi, for inclusion in "Indian Book of Records".



In continuation of this remarkable feat, the special school children of the Department of Special Education and Rehabilitation Science of Alagappa University, performed yogasanas taught by Mahayogam Foundation.

"Zenskar Demo" -- a self-defence art -- was also demonstrated by the members of Maharishi Foundation on this occasion. They also performed a 20-minute yoga demonstration, which could be easily performed by the young and the old.

Inaugurated by Rishi Dr. K.P. Dhayanidhi of Maha Yogam Foundation, the Vice-Chancellor of Alagappa University Dr. S. Subbiah delivered the Presidential Address, in which he stated that the "One and Only Solution for Perfection" is practising yoga. ### INTERNATIONAL YOGA DAY

The International Day of Yoga - 2017 was celebrated at Alagappa University, Karaikudi, on 21.6.2017, as per the direction of the Ministry of Human Resource Development, Government of India and the University Grants Commission. The Centre for Yoga Education and NSS of Alagappa University made arrangements for a mega demonstration of "Common Yoga Protocol".



Presiding over the function, Prof. S. Subbiah, Vice-Chancellor of Alagappa University, stated that the objective of celebrating this Yoga Day is to create awareness among the youth on the significance of yoga for a happy, healthy and contented life. He added that the art of yoga had a hoary tradition of having originated 5000 years ago in India. Realizing the beneficent effects of yoga as a therapy many people from neighboring countries came to India to learn and practise this noble and ancient art.

By practising yoga properly and continuously, one can derive umpteen benefits such as keeping the body and the mind in a serene condition, overcoming outburst of anger and controlling blood pressure. The mind is the only source to control the

five senses and the yoga is the only way to control and achieve equipoise of the mind. The practice of Yogasanas, Pranayama and Meditation together gives a human being abundant energy and helps in preserving the youth and also offers the blessings of longevity. It also helps to have faith in life and acts as a big stress reliever, he added. Yoga is a part of Siddha Medicine. The art of practising Yogasanas acts as a precaution to prevent diseases and when one is afflicted with diseases, it acts as a curative.

The Guinness World Record Yoga Instructor Mrs. BL. Aarthi from Cuddalore, while offering felicitations, lauded the University for establishing a Yoga Centre, which would provide all facilities to students and the public to learn yoga. She said that learning yoga with real passion and involvement would help one to achieve success, attain inner peace and enjoy good health. She exhorted women to practice Niralamba Poorna Chakrasana at least 15 to 20 times a day, so as to increase flexibility of the spine, to overcome constipation and dyspepsia, to stimulate pancreas and to reduce obesity. She advised the students not to skip breakfast, which is very essential for complete health.

As part of the celebrations, a Special Yogasana feat was performed by the Alagappa Matriculation Hr. Secondary School students under the leadership of the International Medalist Selvi C. Kamatchi from Thassim Beevi Abdul Kader College for Women, Kilakarai, affiliated to Alagappa University.



A grand and mega yoga demonstration was conducted at the University Campus, in which 1078 students belonging to Alagappa Model Higher Secondary School, Alagappa Matriculation Higher Secondary School, Sri Vidya Giri Matriculation Higher Secondary Schools, Pudukkottai and Karaikudi and Maharishi Vidya Mandir Higher Secondary School

participated, under the guidance of Thiru Yogesh, the Yoga Master of Alagappa Matriculation Higher Secondary School.

Dr. Senthil Kumaran, Director of Physical Education, and the NSS Programme Officers made elaborate arrangements for the event.

University Officials, Faculty Members, Non-Teaching Staff, Students and the general public enthusiastically participated in the programme. The student-participants were given certificates.

### INTERNATIONAL DAY OF MUSIC

The International Day of Music-2017 was celebrated at Alagappa University on 21.6.2017 at the University Convocation Seminar Hall under the auspices of the Department of Fine Arts.



Presiding over the function, Prof. S. Subbiah, Vice-Chancellor of Alagappa University, highlighted how music reflects the identity of an ethnic group proclaiming their tradition and culture. In Tamil civilization, music, especially folk music, is intrinsically connected with man's life from birth to death, he added. Workers since the dawn of civilization have been using music to get relief from weariness and monotony of their labour. It is indeed a big stress-reliever. He added that thoughts become literature that is nothing but poetry. Poetry is in fact musical thought which is in turn transformed into dance and drama. The tone and the tune, the mood and melody contribute to the message, glad or sad. He also referred to the role of pristine music in embellishing other allied fine arts.

The renowned Dance Researcher Prof. S. Raghuraman from Chennai, in his Special Address, emphasized the importance of documenting the origin and growth of Tamil music. Referring to the hoary tradition of Tamil Music, he said that in spite of varied cultural attacks and encounters by rulers from various regions, countries and cultures, it has not lost its pristine glory. He explained how "Panjams" like potters, weavers, blacksmiths, carpenters and cobblers and hide-traders contributed to the society not only through their avocations but also with pastoral music.

The distinguished speaker, a Visiting Faculty at Kalakshetra, emphasized the need of voice culture suiting one's natural basic tonic in blossoming into a musician of repute like the great Madurai Somu. He referred to the immense use of veena in explaining the swarasthaanas. Class rooms meant for music coaching should be free from external noise pollution. This will facilitate grasping of swaras and singing in at least two octaves. Over straining would result in cracking of vocal chords and formation of follicles, necessitating surgical corrections.

The musicologist also referred to the remarkable Pentatonic Scales in folk music of lore in Tamil Nadu. Evidences are found in classics like Silapathikaram, Thiruvacakam, etc. Ayar Kuravanchi in Silapathikaram can be cited as the finest example. Silapathikaram enumerates varied types of musical instruments the like of which is to be found nowhere. A researcher in music must be well versed in Sociology, Ethno Music, Semiotics and Anthropology to understand the nuances of music.

He pointed out that caste, religion, language and poverty are no barriers to learning music. He cited the example of a boy belonging to a fisherman's family being the topper and a gold medallist in the music examination of a famous institute offering Fine Arts in Chennai.

Earlier Dr. M.S. Sarala, Director, welcomed the gathering. Dr. R. Ravichandran introduced the Chief Guest. Selvi. R. Swetha, a student of Centre for Fine Arts, proposed a vote of thanks.

## WORLD BOOK DAY CELEBRATED

The books are a fountain-head of inspiration sharpening the students' inquisitiveness to know more and more about less and less. With this end in view the 'World Book Day' was celebrated on May 22nd 2017 at Alagappa University Central Library Seminar Hall.



Prof. S. Subbiah, Vice-Chancellor, in his presidential address, referred to the invasion and influence of various mass media on the youth of the present day and emphasized the imperative need for inculcating reading habit among the younger generation by parents and teachers. He added that the impact of printed word is far greater than generally people expect. No living beings except human beings do share and transmit their experience to their posterity. Only human beings pass on their knowledge and experience to the future generation by preserving them in books and other arts. Great leaders like Mahatma Gandhi, Nehru, Ambedkar, Nelson Mandela, Marx, Abraham Lincoln and Charlie Chaplin, he pointed out, were avid readers and he attributed their achievements to the impact of great books they read. He stated that nothing can be equal to the knowledge a person gains through books of great merit, he added. Reading good books will pave the way for the individual's growth as well as nation's development. He added that Alagappa University's Central Library has been



provided with RFID (Radio-Frequency Identification) facility for immediate and easy access to books.

Prof. A. Narayanamoorthy, Member of Syndicate, advised teachers, students, and researchers to select and read only quality books for all their study needs. Only quality books can whet their appetite for knowledge. Good books will be of immeasurable use in higher education, especially in carrying out research. The more and more the researcher reads, the more and more layers of research insights will emerge. Books are, indeed, treasure-pots and reading books will lead to awareness. As books impart knowledge and wisdom needed for a happy life nothing is comparable to the worth of books. #### Celebration of World Poetry Day

The World Poetry Day was observed at the Department of English and Foreign Languages on 21st March 2017. The Former Professor of Tamil in Alagappa Govt. Arts College, Dr. Karmegam, was the chief guest who dwelt at length on the uniqueness and greatness of Tamil Poetry down the ages from the Sangam Age. In the beginning of his discourse, he explained the effectiveness of poetry in general. Poetry, he elaborated, is a powerful literary genre through which any idea, view, knowledge can be

conveyed in a captivating manner. He illustrated that the kernel feature of poetry is to express an idea effectively and imaginatively. It will linger forever in the mind leaving a lasting effect than any other genres. With music being the key feature of poetry, the ideas conveyed through it will become interesting and get printed on memory. Ever since the dawn of human civilization, poetry had been the earliest form of literature in all countries. Tamil poetry takes precedence over other literatures in terms of antiquity. He attributed the unexampled excellence and the undying glory of great literary works such as Tirukkural and Sangam Tamil Poetry to their flowing musical and rhythmic movements. Besides, he quoted profusely from Naladiyar and Sangam Poetry. He remarked that Naladiyar prioritizes scholarship over kingship. He added that this poem says that when there is a comparison between a learned scholar and a powerful king, the former is far superior to the latter.

Then, the renowned speaker made a reference to a poem in Sangam Literature which advocates universal harmony, universal brotherhood and unity. He said that even two millenniums ago our ancient Tamils emphasized the importance of eradicating narrow concepts such as loathsome regionalism, religious fanaticism and communal hatred to achieve a harmonious world with harmonious development. Our forefathers had the rich culture of treating even people from other nations as their brothers. In addition to that, Prof. Karmegam remarked that the world has been taught the great maxim "Good and Evil none will bring" that has been highlighted in Sangam Tamil Poetry. These poems bear testimony to the highly cultivated habits and civilized minds of our ancestors. Over and above, the guest speaker noted that Tirukkural remains as a treasure-house of knowledge, benefiting humanity with its rich and abundant source of knowledge. Then, he cited purple passages from Bharathiyar and Bharathidasan and unravelled the beauty and brevity of thoughts contained in their masterpieces. He said that their writings infused greater amount of optimism and self-confidence in the readers.

Earlier, Dr.PMadhan, Associate Professor of English, in his welcome address, traced the evolution of English poetry from Old English period

to post Modern Age. He quoted from leading poets of English Literature such as Shelley, Keats, Wordsworth and T.S. Eliot. In the end, Dr. Kanimozhi, Assistant Professor of English, proposed a formal vote of thanks.

#### **Ten-Day Workshop on Research Methodology**

A Ten-Day Workshop on Research Methodology in Social Sciences was inaugurated on 24th April 2017 at Alagappa University, Karaikudi. The programme, scheduled from 24th April to 3rd May 2017, was organized by the Department of Women's Studies,

Alagappa University under the aegis of the Indian Council of Social Science Research, New Delhi. 30 Ph.D Researchers from Tamil Nadu, Pondicherry, Kerala, Andhra, Telengana, Karnataka, Maharashtra and Delhi attended the Workshop.

Prof.K.Manimekalai, Dean, Faculty of Arts and Director of the Workshop, in her welcome address, stated that the objective of the Methodology Course is to focus on modern methods of formulating questions and hypotheses, field-work techniques, factor analysis and regression analysis. She added that a hands-on training will be provided on the use of Statistical Package on Social Sciences (SPSS) and R-Statistical Software. Training will also be given on effective presentation of research findings and dissertation writing.



Presiding over the inaugural session Prof.S.Subbiah, Vice-Chancellor, Alagappa University, exhorted the scholars to take up serious research useful to society. An in-depth surveying by way of review of earlier researches is a must for finding out the research "gaps" to arrive at innovative topics and explore areas relevant to the times. Mastering sampling methods, surveying methods, statistical strategy, and identifying the data by careful analysis and proper interpretation are other significant components of social science research, which the scholars have to concentrate assiduously. He said that Alagappa University provides modern



facilities such as good ambience and excellent library facilities with easy access to research journals so as to help researchers to pursue good research in different fields of study. He hoped that this 10-Day Workshop would be highly useful in motivating and enlightening the young scholars to bring out quality research.

Prof.K.Baskar, Vice-Chancellor, Manonmaiam Sundaranar University, Tirunelveli, in his keynote address, highlighted the importance of research in developing nations. He said that serious research in the field of science and technology is needed for industrial development of a nation whereas the research in social sciences paves the way for a society's progress and development. All research endeavours should address societal needs and offer pragmatic solutions for solving problems confronted by the society at large. Identifying appropriate issues that are region-specific is very important in social science research for the contribution to the development of the society concerned. Literature survey is a very important component while undertaking research. Focusing on "serious thinking process" will result in finding out solutions for the research problems identified. He briefed the importance of publishing the new explorations of the researchers in International Journals instead of letting them lie in cold storage. He appealed to the young participants to involve themselves in serious research programmes that should be highly useful to the society. He insisted that "Unless we produce more number of good researches in social studies we cannot transform the society". Social Scientists should sensitize people about various problems confronted by the present generation.

Dr.N.K.Bhuvanewari, Project Associate, Centre for Women's Studies, proposed a vote of thanks.

The first session of the course was engaged by Prof.K.Manimekalai, Dean, Faculty of Arts who introduced the participants to the basic aspects of research, its importance and its characteristics. #### Three-Day Workshop on Developing Proposal for Qualitative Research

The inaugural function of a three-day Workshop on “Developing Proposal for Qualitative Research” was organized under the joint auspices of the

Department of Education, Alagappa University, Karaikudi and the State Educational Research and Training Institute (SCERT), Chennai, on 13.06.2017 at the Seminar Hall of the Central Library of Alagappa University.



Inaugurating the Workshop, Prof. S. Subbiah, Vice-Chancellor, said that a teacher should not remain merely as a teacher but should also be a good administrator involving himself in research activities. A teacher must develop interest in studying human behavior, in order to find out the interest, enthusiasm and innate abilities of his students. If teachers possess administrative abilities coupled with research tendencies, the institutions in which they work will certainly develop and progress. He exhorted the teachers to be good educationists to contribute to human welfare. Further he said that research is a careful, scientific, diligent inquiry in order to explore uncovered areas and generate new knowledge useful to the society. Elaborating the two terms he said the quantitative research is based on the measurement of quantity and qualitative research is concerned with the phenomena relating to quality. He emphasized the significance of both. He added that a keen observation, collection of relevant data, identification, analysis and interpretation go into the making of a good and serious research, which should be a well planned procedure and a step-by-step exploration.

Dr. Thirugnanasambandam, Principal, District Institute of Educational Training (DIET), Kalaiyarkoil, delivered the keynote address in which he highlighted the importance of Case Studies of the individual students to find out their abilities so as to guide them properly to develop their potential. All research done by the teachers should concentrate on developing skills in students for a nation's progress.

Dr. P. Sivakumar, Dean, Faculty of Education, Alagappa University; and Dr. Chelladurai, Principal, DIET, Pudukkottai offered felicitations. Mr. Inbaraj, Reader, SCERT, delivered the thematic address.

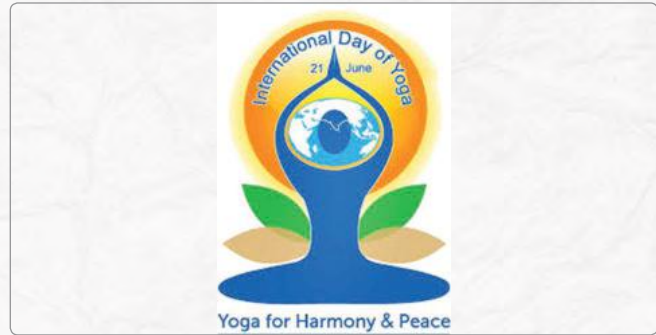
